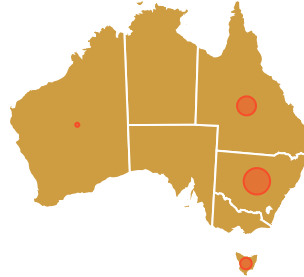

## Maritime Training

Training is concentrated in NSW 42%, followed by Queensland 23%, Tasmania 11% and Western Australia 8%.



Emerging technology and automation are reshaping industry and seafarers will require upskilling to keep pace with these changes. Maritime operational skills will be needed for e-navigation, autonomous berthing and unberthing or automated mooring, plus dredging operational skills for seafarers to conduct capital dredging operations.
